

Tip of the Month: Windows Taskbar



Move your most frequently used program icons to the Windows Taskbar, the blue bar at the bottom of the screen next to the Start button.

Use your mouse to "drag" the icon to where you would like it to go on the taskbar. Now your program icons are always visible, even when other windows are open on screen. You can delete the original icon to clean up a crowded or cluttered desktop.

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Half-day technology workshops announced



Coming up in November and December at MCISD are two half-day technology workshops related to Language Arts and Math.

Teachers of grades 4 through 6 can enhance their students' Young Authors experience through Digital Storytelling. Computers, digital cameras and scanners have made it possible for teachers and students in all grades to create and preserve their own personal stories and to share those stories with a worldwide audience. Teachers and students will be encouraged to share their digital stories with other classrooms participating

in the Young Authors' Conference. This workshop is scheduled for Wednesday, November 14 from 12 noon to 3:15 PM.

The math workshop is entitled Inspire Students to Interpret Data and will be held on Thursday, December 6 from 3:15 PM to 6:30 PM. This session will give middle school and high school teachers the opportunity to discover the power of InspireData software. Each teacher will receive a sample copy of InspireData which includes more than 50 standards-based databases and examples in science, mathematics, and social studies. This software allows students to process large amounts of information, both numerical and textual, in a visual manner. It will also be a great review tool for high school ACT practice.

David Warlick is one of the keynote speakers at the 2007 Countywide In-service on November 1st. But he is also the keynote speaker for the 2007 K-12 Online Conference. You can attend this conference "virtually" any time day or night. All sessions are recorded, so if you can't attend at the designated time you can watch or listen to it later.

This conference focuses primarily on the use of Web 2.0 tools in the K-12 classroom such as blogs, wikis, and podcasts. But there are plenty of sessions on other topics like using cell phones in the classroom, Moodle, collaborative concept mapping and many others.

The strands of the online conference include: Classroom 2.0, New Tools, Professional Learning Networks, and Obstacles to Opportunities. Presenters include well known and respected bloggers and podcasters from around the world including Clarence Fischer from Canada, and Jeff Utecht from Shanghai, China. Many of the presenters have spoken at state and national technology conferences like MACUL and NECC.

The conference begins with Mr. Warlick's keynote on Monday, October 8 at 7 PM, and ends on Saturday, October 27. But remember, you can replay any session at any time or even download it to your own computer!
